Mark Mitchell, DO, FACOEP, FACEP is President of the American College of Osteopathic Emergency Physicians (ACOEP). Currently, there are approximately 5,000 members of this specialty college and about sixty (60) Osteopathic Emergency Medicine Residency Programs. He has served as a member of the Board of Directors for twelve years. He has been received the ACOEP Mentor of the Year Award, as well as the Meritorious Award. He is a member of the American College of Emergency Physicians (ACEP) and serves on the Federal Government Affairs Committee. In addition he serves as Chairman of the Bureau of Osteopathic Specialty Societies of the American Osteopathic Association.

Dr. Mitchell currently is Senior Medical Officer for Infinity-MEDS in Illinois. In addition, he works clinically at several hospitals including St. John's Hospital in Springfield which is a teaching hospital and Level I Trauma Center.
