

## **Greg Hufstetler—Bio**

Greg has coordinated the reimbursement and regulatory affairs, as well as the managed care activities, of Reimbursement Technologies, Inc. (RTI) since 1994. RTI is a subsidiary of EmCare, and is the nation's largest coding and billing company for emergency physician groups, billing in 40 states for approximately 600 groups, accounting for 13 million emergency department visits and almost 3 million hospitalist encounters per year. In 2015 RTI collected almost \$2.5 billion a year for its physician groups.

Prior to joining RTI, Greg had 20 years of healthcare finance experience with large medical centers in the Philadelphia area like the Thomas Jefferson University Hospital and the Crozer-Chester Medical Center. He also functioned in healthcare reimbursement in public accounting with Laventhol and Horwath, and in Medicare Intermediary Part A auditing of hospital cost reports with Aetna.

In addition to holding an MBA from Temple University's Fox School of Business, Greg is a CPA and a Fellow in the Healthcare Financial Management Association (HFHMA). Greg is a founding member of the Emergency Department Practice Management Association (EDPMA), and a board member. In 2009 Greg was the recipient of EDPMA's highest honor, the Founder's Award. In 2014 Greg was featured by the American College of Emergency Physicians (ACEP) as one of 5 non-clinical professionals who were "unsung heroes of emergency medicine," and whose interviews on the future of emergency medicine were published in one of ACEP's national publications.
